

Professor Brian K. P. Goh

Professor Brian K. P. Goh is presently senior consultant surgeon and adjunct professor at the Department of Hepatopancreatobiliary (HPB) and Transplant Surgery, Singapore General Hospital. He is Deputy Head at the SingHealth-Duke National University of Singapore Liver Transplant center and also serves as both the director of pancreatic surgery and director of robotic surgery in his department.

Dr Goh's clinical expertise is in abdominal organ transplantation (liver, kidney and pancreas) and in the treatment of complex benign and malignant HPB diseases. He underwent advanced fellowship training in HPB surgery at Singapore General Hospital between 2007 to 2009 and the American Society of Transplant Surgeons accredited abdominal organ transplantation fellowship program at the Mayo Clinic Rochester between 2009 to 2011.

Dr Goh has a keen interest in developing minimally invasive HPB surgery and is a pioneer of robotic HPB surgery in Southeast Asia. He has personally performed over 300 major minimally-invasive HPB surgeries since 2012 including over 80 major robotic HPB procedures. He has proctored numerous surgeons and performed live demonstrations in the region

Dr Goh has a Master of Science in research and is active in both clinical and translational research. He has held over SGD 50 million in grant funding and has authored or co-authored over 200 PubMed indexed articles. His work has been cited over 4800 times and he has a H index of 40. He is frequently invited to share his clinical and research expertise and has delivered more than 150 scientific presentations at meetings world-wide.
